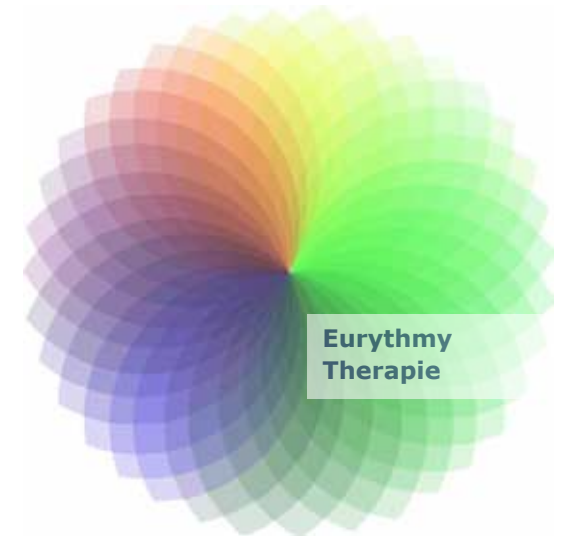

Eurythmy therapists in the International Eurythmy Therapy Forum foster sharing and collaboration, in order to develop quality guidelines in trainings, accreditation and the content of further training and development.

Organisation and financing

The International Forum sees its social form as an organism responsible for its own development.

It nurtures a life of the spirit in which individual development and initiatives are called for. Carriers of initiative thus share and communicate their various working relationships and their relationships arising through agreements — so that a shared awareness of the needs and potential of the individual in the context of the whole can come about.

The Forum lives in the initiatives, competencies and communal awareness among eurythmy therapists worldwide.

The annual **Journal** shares information on the current state of the professional community in each country (see www.heileurythmie-medsektion.net/en/journal).

The organisation and **finances** are accessible to all members of the Forum and of the Medical Section.

The work of the Forum is financed entirely by 'solidarity contributions' from all eurythmy therapists and through donations and charitable trusts.

The coordinators share responsibility for fostering the work of the Forum as a network and publish summaries of important developments.

International Delegates' Conference

Its task: sharing and exchange of views and experiences; communal creation of ideas for the international professional community.

International Trainers' Council

Its task: elaborating quality criteria, assurance and development for eurythmy therapy in all the recognised eurythmy therapy trainings.

Further trainings: Teeth eurythmy therapy, eye eurythmy therapy, tone eurythmy therapy

International Professional Associations

Ten professional associations have agreed a common professional profile, code of ethics, methodological guidelines and the international trademark **AnthroMed® Eurythmy Therapy**. Work has been undertaken at national level on legal recognition of the profession to ensure the right to practise it.

Associations of eurythmy therapists and arts therapies have come together in the **International Federation of Anthroposophic Arts and Eurythmy Therapies**.

Fields of Practice

Early Years, Schools, Therapeutic Education and Social Therapy, Elderly People, Clinics and Private Practice.

The task: quality development through specialist further training and professional sharing and exchange.

Joint Coordination Team

Its task: deliberating on short, medium and long term aims, and implementing them in the coordination areas of training and research; professional associations; fields of practice; and public relations. Proactive preliminary work and collaboration by the coordinators.
